Relax and enjoy the scenery... first stop... **Multnomah Falls** for a cup of coffee and one of their wonderful cinnamon rolls.

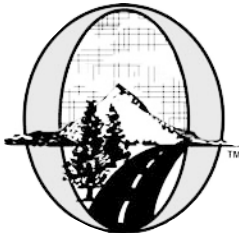
Pendelton: We'll descend into Pendelton's wild past as we tour the famous **Pendelton Underground**. Next, we'll head for the **Tamastlikt Cultural Institute and Museum**. We will have a guided tour by a local Tribal member through this state-of-the-art interpretive center. The Museum features awe-inspiring exhibits that present the national story of westward expansion from the perspective of the **Cayuse, Umatilla, and Walla Walla Tribes**. Our catered dinner here is always fabulous...

Joseph: Joseph is located at the base of the Wallowa Mountains, the gateway to the Eagle Cap Wilderness area. On arrival we'll have lunch at our favorite place, **The Outlaw Café & Pub...** After lunch we meet our wonderful guide who'll take us on a journey through time as we learn about **Chief Joseph** and the **Nez Perce** people. Then settle into our home for the next 2 nights **the Eagle Cap Chalets...** Breath in the Mountain air as we ride the **Wallowa Lake Tramway**, the steepest in North America to the top of Mt. Howard. From here see as many as 3 different states. It is referred to as "The best view in all of Oregon". Another highlight today is a visit to the **nationally acclaimed Foundry - Valley Bronze**. Your afternoon is free to explore the town and see the **many bronze sculptures** the area is famous for - stroll on one of the wilderness trails, rent a paddle boat, play miniature golf or just soak up the surroundings. Our catered "picnic" dinner will be the perfect ending to our stay here.

Baker City: Once considered to be the **premier social center** along the Oregon Trail... Our home for the night is the famous **Geiser Grand Hotel**. Sunset Magazine says the **Geiser Grand** is "the finest hotel between Salt Lake and Seattle". Come explore this architectural jewel, and find out why the Geiser's spectacular restoration received **The National Honor Award for Excellence in Historic Preservation**. Perhaps we'll have a **visit from the resident ghosts!** Next, visit the **National Historic Oregon Trail Interpretive Center**. They bring the voices of the trail back to life with unique living history...

John Day: We'll head west today - First stop **the Sumpter Gold Dredge park** - see the last of the three dredges that operated in the 30's. Next witness a 40 million year record of plant and animal life at the **John Day Fossil Beds National Monument**. Enjoy a picnic lunch and ranger conducted talk about the geology and paleontology of the area. Onward to the "**Painted Hills**". They tell the story of what the life and landscape of John Day country was like about 30 million years ago.

Bend: Our day ends in the deluxe comforts of **Shilo Inn...** Relax in comfort and as always expect a **wonderful dinner...** after breakfast we're off to the world class **High Desert Museum**. There are many varied exhibits and always something new! Then visit the quaint town of **Sisters**, a perfect place to browse and have lunch before we head for home. **Discover all the wonders Oregon is famous for on the NE Oregon Trail!**
