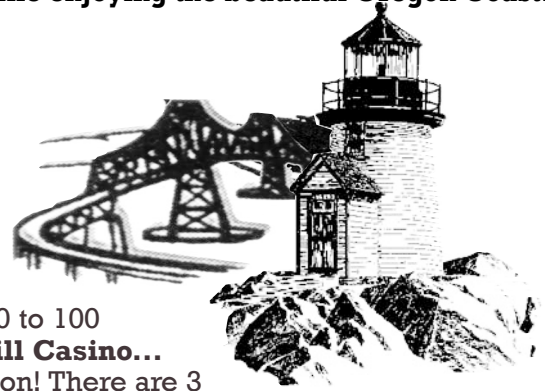

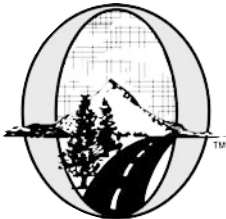
Discover some out-of-the-way places and hidden gems... while enjoying the beautiful Oregon Coast...

First stop is **Dean Creek Elk Viewing Area** home to a herd of 60 to 100 Roosevelt elk... Enjoy some free time for lunch and play at **the Mill Casino**... Next it's **Clausen Oyster Farm** the largest oyster grower in Oregon! There are 3 crops being rotated on 720 acres of submerged tide flats. Learn the adventures of running an oyster business... Our home for the next 2 nights... **The Sunset Oceanfront Lodging at Face Rock**... Beautifully situated on high grounds overlooking a sandy beach, majestic sea stacks and the Pacific Ocean. Tonight we'll dine across the street at **Lord Bennet's**... featuring great food, soothing surroundings, awesome artwork and some of the best views on the coast! Next day we're headed to **Port Orford** and **The Lifeboat Station/Museum**... It was constructed in 1934 by the U.S. Coast Guard to provide lifesaving service to the southern portion of the Oregon coast, a service performed until 1970. Lunch is at the **Crazy Norwegian's Restaurant**... famous for their Fish & Chips and more! We'll stop at **Cape Blanco Lighthouse**... famous for the oldest continuously operating light, the highest focal plane above the sea, (256 feet) and Oregon's first woman keeper, Mabel E. Bretherton. Next it's the **Myrtle Point Logging Museum**... You'll first notice the unusual appearance of the Museum's dome-shaped building, which was actually built and designed by the local chapter of the Latter Day Saints. Today a large assortment of antique logging equipment, railroad items, old photographs and myrtlewood carvings are on display... We have a special treat in store for you tonight... We will **learn the ancient art of "Nautical Knots Making"**- this excellent hands-on demonstration is both fun and interesting. The next morning meet **Marty our guide for the day**... she will take us **beachcombing for gems** (this is optional) before we head to the **West Coast Game Park**. This is the **original walk-thru Safari**, where we can meet, pet, film or walk among hundreds of free roaming wildlife. Imagine seeing majestic adult lions, tigers, snow leopards, bears and more! Marty will share the history and lore of the area as we travel up beautiful Highway 101. We'll stop in **Old Town Florence for some free time and lunch**. This quaint fishing village is situated on the banks of the Siuslaw River. It has been beautifully restored and is home to several restaurants and art galleries... We'll continue North to Newport and our home for the night **The Elizabeth Street Inn**. Sitting high on a bluff overlooking the beach... it features great views and fireplaces in each room... Our fairwell dinner will be one to remember... **dine under the sea in the "Passages of the Deep" in the Aquarium**. This unique setting combines the Aquarium and the Gleason event room to allow a stroll through the undersea setting while enjoying dinner. It's time to head home but the fun isn't over... We stop at **Pyromania for a glass blowing demonstration** before we head to the **Rogue Brewery for a tour, tasting and lunch**.... This one is loaded with history.... adventure and fun!!!
