

# Wallace & Spokane

Wallace has the only downtown in America listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The buildings with pointed roofs, rounded cupolas, and red-brick all look like they were built in the late-1800's... and many of them were! See the most famous manhole-cover in America, which proudly proclaims Wallace as "The Center of the Universe". Spokane... it's Riverfront park is awesome! From the world's largest Radio Flyer wagon to the amazing views of the river. The World's Fair Expo was held here in 1974, and a lot of the remnants from this can still be seen around town and throughout the park.


Enjoy the scenery as we make our way through the Columbia River Gorge... First stop the **Columbia Gorge Discovery Center...** the official interpretive center for the Columbia River Gorge National Scenic Area. It holds interactive displays which bring to life the tremendous volcanic upheavals and raging floods that created the Gorge. Welcome to the **Ice Harbor Brewing Company** at the Marina in Kennewick... enjoy the view and some great food... Enjoy the scenery as we make our way to the Silver Valley and our home for the next two nights **Wallace, Idaho**. The town has long been famous as the "Silver Capital of the World". We'll indulge in a great dinner at the hotel before we say goodnight.

Meet Rick the "**The Prime Minister**" of Wallace he will be our host and guide for the next few days. First stop **The Mission of the Sacred Heart...** it was constructed between 1850 and 1853 by Catholic Missionaries and members of the Coeur d'Alene Tribe. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the Mission provides an educational experience not found anywhere else. You'll have some free time in the historic downtown for lunch and shopping... you may want to check out the **Oasis Bordello Museum...** It was once a cathouse, and it was open for business until 1988. That's right. While Nancy Reagan was telling America "Just Say No," the ladies of the Oasis were saying "Yes" to any man with twenty bucks. Next, we tour the **Sierra Silver Mine...** An experienced miner is your guide as you walk through the main drift of an actual underground silver mine. You'll have some time to rest up before we head to Lake Coeur d'Alene where we'll enjoy a sunset dinner cruise on one of the most beautiful lakes in the Northwest.

Were off to Spokane... Our first stop is **Gonzaga University** where we'll meet our wonderful step on guide and take in the **Bing Crosby House Museum...** Where more than 200 pieces of Bing Crosby artifacts are on display. We'll tour Spokane and learn about its history and more! Welcome to the beautiful and **historic Davenport Hotel** our home for the next two nights. We'll learn all about this gorgeous place on a tour... it has been world famous since it opened in September of 1914. It was the first hotel with air conditioning, a central vacuum system, housekeeping carts (designed by Louis Davenport himself). Dinner tonight is at the Steam Plant Grill... The result of a remarkable vision to repurpose one of the city's most recognizable landmarks.

Today we'll head to the **Spokane Scottish Highland Games...** a charming Scottish day-adventure full of entertainment, feats of triumph, and fun... Enjoy the traditional features of Scottish Highland Games, such as massed bands, pipe band exhibitions, individual piping, heavy athletics, highland dancing and more! We'll head back to Riverfront park where we'll take the **SkyRide Gondolas over the falls...** Named "One of the Top 12 Scenic Cable Rides in the World" in 2013 by Conde Nast Traveler. We'll travel past City Hall, then gradually drop down 200 feet over the Huntington Park Natural Area. From there, you will continue across the River in front of one set of falls and return to Riverfront Park. Dinner tonight is at another landmark **Clinkerdaggers!**

We'll make our way home, but the fun isn't over. First stop... The **SAGE Center in Boardman**. It is an interactive visitor center that highlights sustainable agriculture and energy. Developed by the Port of Morrow. We'll have a **delightful catered lunch** here before we tour the museum. Join us as we see and experience some great Northwest Territory!
